At Mothers' Home, we offer more than shelter—we provide a lifeline. Here, pregnant women facing homelessness, abuse or abandonment find safety, support, and the opportunity to begin again. And for each newborn we welcome into the world, we offer the care and security every child deserves.

Meet one of our current residents. Her story is one of transformation and courage:

*I grew up in Delaware County and some difficulties I faced were physical and emotional abuse, which greatly damaged my self-image and self-worth. My father was not involved because he wanted to avoid my mother who suffers with her mental health and is extremely abusive to her children, husband and extended family. I found out I was pregnant one week before my 22nd birthday. I became homeless because I lived with my child's father, but he fell on hard times and was not trying hard enough to pick himself back up and I couldn't financially support the household and prepare for our baby alone. The pressure on both of us was making the relationship very volatile, so I left.*

*At Mothers' Home, I learned a lot about self-preservation and putting myself first. I have also learned how it feels to be a part of a community as my story is not as rare as I thought. I have realized this season of my life is not permanent. My goals are to move into my own home, go back to school to become a Board-Certified Behavior Analyst, complete my poetry collection and publish it and live my biggest, most impactful life using all the gifts God gave me. I will be moving soon!! I got a section 8 voucher and I'm going to re-enroll in school next year. My daughter was born on October 30, 2024. She is the unconditional love I've been searching for my whole life. She's brought back wonder and excitement to my life. She is the best parts of her father and me. Being her mother has boosted my confidence and inspired me to do all I can to live to my full potential.*
